#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

### **Learning Models after the Winter Break**

Chairwoman Codianne provided a historical review on this topic, advising the conversation was started at the November 18<sup>th</sup> meeting, at the regular meeting on December 16<sup>th</sup> the topic was raised again due to the rising COVID cases and area districts going to a full remote for a period after the winter break. Chairwoman Codianne advised at as of 5 PM today the Committee has received 98 emails from parents supporting both sides of this topic (stay hybrid or go remote for a period of time after the Winter Break). Chairwoman Codianne advised there are three options; Option One – is to stay status quo with the current learning model with the understanding that a decision to move to remote learning would be made on a school by school basis depending on a schools ability to adequately staff their building; Option Two –move to full remote learning from January 4<sup>th</sup> and return to the hybrid model on January 19<sup>th</sup>.

Chairman Codianne advised it is important for families to remember that if the district stays in the hybrid model it does not mean that at some point a pivot would be made "on a time" to go into a full remote model and asked parents to make sure they had a contingency plan in place in case this were to occur.

Chairwoman Codianne polled the members to see what option the majority was in favor of; consensus is option one.
