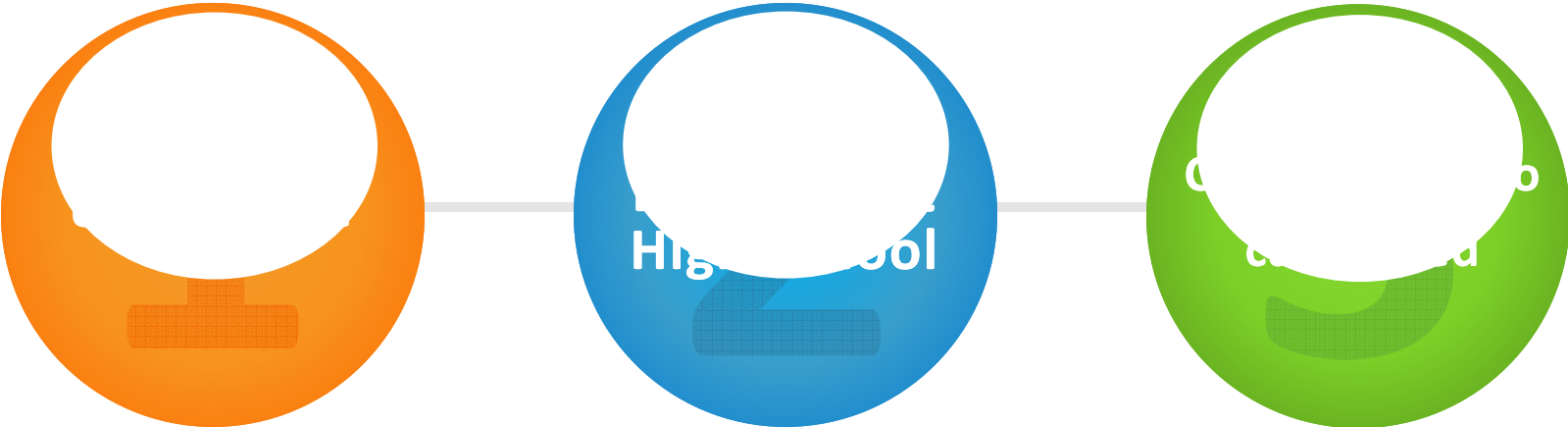

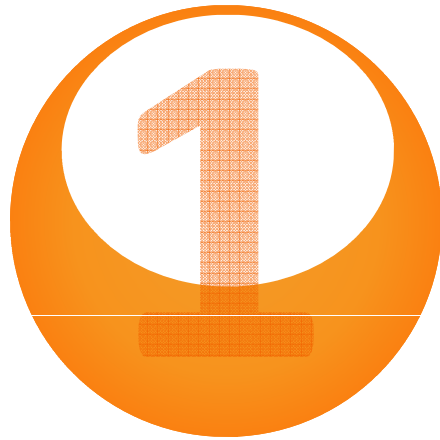

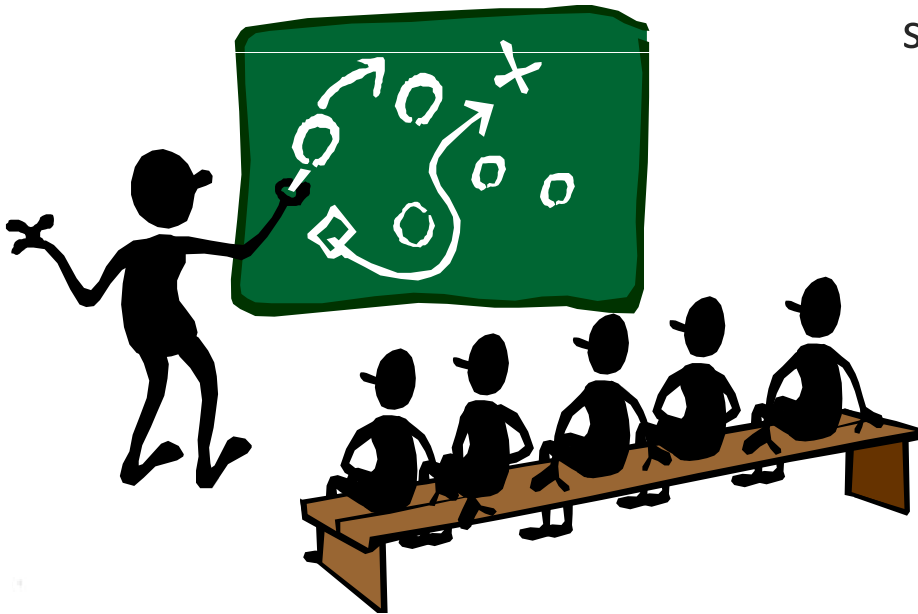

Every curriculum is important and each one connects students to learning!



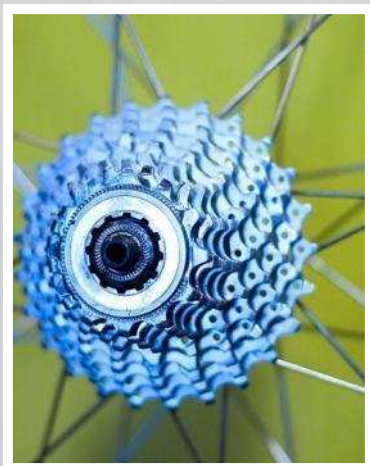

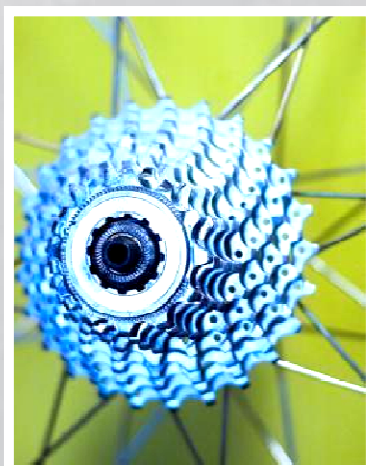

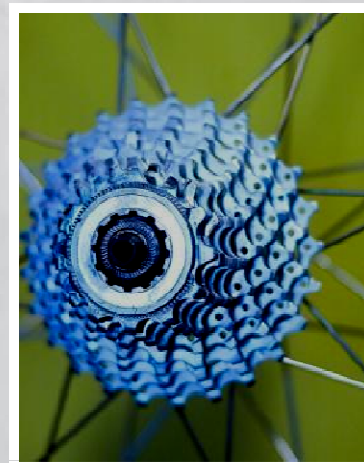
Here's the evolving proposal for Middle School Honor Roll



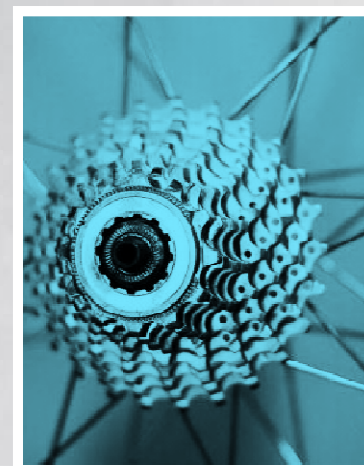

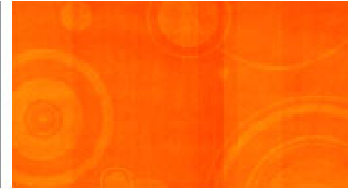
