5) Special Ed Staffing shortage - Which schools are being impacted. How are schools notified? How can we support parents? How do we reach out to them?

Sepac will draft a letter to Joan and Kirk Notes: Center School - Last year there was only one K-3rd grade special educator. They brought another part time employee to help this Special Education Teacher. Preschool teacher at Center is no longer there. The full time Special Education Teacher recently quit. The part time person is now going to take over the caseload.

This new teacher is taking on 1.5 caseload. Bolton - Early Rise a group of teachers (3 teachers) left. That program is not being serviced by assistants. Sawyer - Parent reports that 7 months since an evaluation a student is not receiving push in services. How do parents know that kids are getting their services? Parents can ask for daily logs.
